The season is over for all other liveball teams, and the teeball and modball teams have two more weekends to go.


I look forward to seeing you all on presentation day, please put it in your diary now.

MATCH REPORTS

14U Graham Hay League Carlingford vs Rouse Hill Result: Win 3-1

Last game of the regular season and a good test against Rouse Hill, who we will play in the wild-card game in the first round of the playoffs, to play Castle Hill in the three game final series. A real pitching duel with excellent pitching from both teams.

The game was decided by one of the those strange rules in baseball - the dropped third-strike rule. The scores were tied 1-1 going into the bottom of the last innings and we successfully advanced three batters in a row to first base on dropped third strike and from that we scored two run to win the game. We had no hits in that last innings. Checking back over the plays, there were five strikeouts to the pitcher in that last innings. (with a dropped third strike, the strikeout is recorded against the batter pitcher.) By and to the **MLB** this investigations. is RECORD. Never is the history of the MLB has five strikeouts occurred in the one innings. We are claiming the record!!!!

There is actually some learnings here for all Junior players and that is know the drop third strike rule and know when it is in play. As a reminder, On an uncaught third strike with (1) no runner on first base,

or (2) with a runner on first base and two <u>outs</u>, the <u>batter</u> immediately <u>becomes</u> a <u>runner</u>. The strike is called, but the <u>umpire</u> does not call the batter out. What we did really well was the coaches did not have to yell to the runner to run, our batters knew dropped third strike was in play and took advantage.

Yes we won game, however we had only two hits and 14 strikeouts. We won't win the playoff game with that many strikeouts. Rouse Hill have quality pitchers, who don't pitch heat but mix it up with a lot of change up and pitch strikes. They pitched 66% strikes on Saturday. Our top-to-middle order has to adjust to the pitching and be very patient and know the pitch to hit, or else we won't be playing in the final series.
